The center will be located within the John and Mary Poppajohn Biomedical Discovery Building in Iowa City, Iowa.

Notable Achievements

Mother's Day

During an Eagles Memorial Service in 1904, Frank E. Hering delivered a keynote address that is widely recognized as the "First Public Plea" for a day to honor mothers. It was through the involvement of the Eagles that the concept for Mother's Day first spread around the country.

Social Security

After President Franklin Delano Roosevelt signed the Social Security Act in 1935, he presented the pen to the Eagles for our "vision and courage" in making it happen. Roosevelt was a longtime member of the Order.

Jobs After 40

When President Lyndon B. Johnson signed this bill ending age discrimination in the workplace, he presented the pen to the Eagles and proclaimed "the Eagles started this whole idea."

Medicare

When President Johnson signed the bill to pass Medicare, he presented the Eagles with the pen for their "energetic and dedicated espousal of social justices ... and the compassionate treatment of the sick and disabled."
